## **BACKGROUND**



- Collaboration between Lancashire County Council, BT, BDUK and Blackpool and Blackburn Borough Councils
- LCC Secured £37m+ of Public Sector Investment to intervene in 'white' areas (in additional to commercial rollout)
  - 67% BT/Openreach commercial fibre rollout
  - 21% intervention (public/private funded) fibre rollout (the Superfast Lancashire programme)
  - 9% other operators' high speed broadband services
- Lancashire Superfast Targets
  - 97% of Lancashire Homes and Businesses planned to have access to broadband speeds above 24mbps by March 2016
  - 99% of Lancashire Home and Businesses planned to have access to broadband speeds above 24mbps by March 2018



### **PROGRESS UPDATE**



- 124,000 premises currently with access to Superfast Broadband ,up to 134,000 by March 16 (another 12,000 with speeds above 2mbps).
- 9,000+ eligible businesses currently with access to Superfast Broadband (in the 'white' area)
- 100+ business sites with access to Superfast Broadband
- 454 SMEs received business support related to the exploitation of Superfast Broadband access.
- 854 structures out of 934 now built and providing service (Sept 15)
- Use of different technologies based upon vfm issues
  - Fibre to the Cabinet (FttC)



### **PROGRESS UPDATE**



### 47,425 premises in Chorley Borough of which

- 30,276 in Commercial Area
- 17,149 in public intervention area

#### As of November 2015

- 15,808 premises have access to the Fibre Broadband Network
- 2,188 premises can achieve speeds up to 23.9mbps(possibly due to distance from cabinet), and
- 13,620 in excess of 24mbps
- 86.15% of Chorley can access Superfast speeds and the contract is for 85% Lancashire wide

Three more structures to be delivered by March 2016 which will take coverage in Intervention Area up to 16678



## **Superfast Extension Programme**



Superfast Extension programme (up to £7.34m) funded equally by LCC/BDUK starting in early 2016 delivered by BT

BT currently undertaking planning of delivery based around 3 phases and involving 12,000 premises (1500 + post codes)

The SEP will be more expensive as a result of delivery in the hardest to reach areas involving more build and use of Fibre to the Premise (FttP)

The SEP will deliver to 4 post codes in Chorley and is planned to provide access to covering 50+ more premises by March 2018.

Currently looking at alternative solutions for the premises that are not included in the Phase 1 rollout or the SEP – approx. 400 premises

Working with delivery contractor (BT) to identify premises to be covered by the SEP.


## BT's fibre broadband roll-out

£2.5bn investment to bring "superfast" fibre broadband to around two-thirds of UK premises


- Available to more than 24 million homes and businesses and we are passing over 70,000 additional premises nationally per week
- A mixture of fibre to the cabinet (FTTC) and fibre to the premise technology (FTTP)
- On track to extend superfast broadband to 95% of UK homes and businesses by 2017
- New G.fast technology will further increase download speeds from 2017

No other company in the world is investing as much in fibre without public sector support or a regulatory regime that allows for far greater returns





## The Chorley area already has surextensive fibre broadband coverage



- Almost 97% of premises in Chorley can order fibre broadband today.
- Of the remaining premises, plans are in place as follows:
  - Circa 200 premises remain in Hoghton & Coppull which the Superfast Lancashire programme aim to complete during January 2016
  - 600 premises remain in the Openreach commercial rollout
- Provides total coverage of around 98% of the Chorley District
- Take up in the Chorley area is currently 23.7%; Overall Lancs average is 20%

### **Extending Fibre Broadband Coverage Further**

- The Superfast Extension Programme (SEP), deployed by Superfast Lancashire is designed to extend fibre broadband reach
- The Chorley area currently has additional premises in the plan, fed from the exchanges in Chorley, Hoghton, Eccleston, Brinscall and Croston

## But how do we get beyond 97%.....



### **Super Fast Extension Programme (SEP)**

- UK government announced a further £250m of funding for superfast broadband.
   Lancashire awarded £3.8m, this will be match funded bringing circa £8m in extra funding.
- Contract signed with BT in April 2015, with planning commencing in October 2015. Circa 11k additional premises will be covered by the SEP programme

### **Further coverage through Gains Share Advance**

BT is making funding available from the contract earlier than originally planned.
 Subject to agreement with LCC this funding will extend coverage beyond that already agreed within the first two build phases.
