05.SLA.1 APPLICATION TO VARY PREMISES LICENCE IN RESPECT OF ST CHADS PARISH CENTRE 235 TOWN LANE, WHITTLE-LE-WOODS

The Director of Legal Services submitted a report requesting the Sub-Committee to determine an application to vary a premises licence in respect of St Chads Parish Centre, 235 Town Lane, Whittle-le-Woods.

The current licensable activities was:

Monday - Saturday 11.00 - 23.00 Sunday and Good Friday 12.00 - 22.30

Christmas Day 12.00 - 15.00 and 19.00 - 22.30

New Year's Eve 11.00 - 11.00 (next morning by virtue of the

deregulation order)

- regulated entertainment for private members club or private hire during the above hours
- the current licence was also subject to a number of embedded conditions in relation to those embedded in the Licensing Act 1964.

Under Section 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Authority must have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and the four licensing objectives.

In this respect the Sub-Committee received additional steps they would take to promoting the licensing objectives in relation to:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

A copy of the application to vary the existing licence and allow the following licensable activities during the times indicated was attached to the submitted report.

- Regulated Entertainment
 - 1. Live Music Indoors

Monday - Sunday inclusive 11.00 - 01.00.

Live entertainers will be engaged to perform live music in the premises, live bands etc primarily at private family functions.

2. Provision of facilities for making music - Indoors

Mondays to Sunday inclusive 11.00 - 01.00.

Karaoke by means of amplified equipment.

- 3. Recorded Music Indoors
 - Mondays Sundays inclusive 11.00 01.00 playing of recorded music will take place on the premises in the form of discos at family functions.
- 4. Provision of facilities for dancing Indoors

Monday - Sunday inclusive 11.00 - 01.00

Dancing provided in function room to enable dancing on the premises designated dance floor area 25' by 20'.

- Supply of Alcohol On or off the premises Monday - Sunday inclusive 11.00 - 01.00 New Years Eve - deregulated hours.
- Late Night Refreshment Indoors
 Monday Sunday inclusive 23.00 01.00
 Occasionally functions accompanied by buffet or HA PA Supper after 11.00pm.

The report also outlined the additional measures that the applicant had indicated which would be taken to provide and ensure the achievement of the four relevant licensing objectives.

The application had been brought to the Sub-Committee following an objection from an Interested Party, occupants, of a neighbouring property, based on the noise and the lateness of the noise from the premises.

The Sub-Committee received representations in respect of the application from the applicant, his representative as well as the interested party to the application.

No objections had been received from responsible authorities. The Committee considered all the representations together with the Article 8, rights of both the applicant, and the interested party and included the proportionality principle.

The Sub-Committee Members raised a number of pertinent issues with the applicant and his representative as well as the interested party and considered all the written and verbal evidence in the context of the provision of the Councils adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and Government guidelines. After taking account of all representations and relevant factors, the Sub-Committee arrived at the following unanimous decision.

RESOLVED - That the Licensing Sub-Committee have considered carefully the applicants and the interested parties representations.

We have considered the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 together with the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in particular those paragraphs referred to in the report.

The Sub-Committee has had regard to the fact that no responsible authorities have made representation to the application. Whilst the Committee take account of the interested parties representations on disturbance they have suffered, the Committee also take account that there have been no representations from Environmental Health in particular.

The Sub-Committee also took account that the Statement of Licensing Policy indicates that fixed predetermined closing times will be avoided unless necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee also took account of the applicants representations that the hours sought were not to be operated 7 days per week but would provide flexibility for occasional events.

The Licensing Sub-Committee mindful of residential amenity, were of the view that the steps put forward by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives, in particular, prevention of public nuisance were such that they would address the main objectives for the interested party.

The Sub-Committee were of the view that the conditions offered up in the application were within the direct control of the licence holder and would minimise the impact of licensable activities.

The Sub-Committee also considered human rights implications, in particular Article 8 and Article 1 of the 1st Protocol, the proportionality principle.

In considering all the above factors, the Sub-Committee, balancing the interests of the interested party and the applicant, resolved to grant the application subject to those conditions set out in the operating Schedule and Paragraph 9 of the report.

Monday - Sunday inclusive 23.00 hours - 01.00 hours Occasionally functions accompanied by buffet or Hot Pot Supper after 23.00 hours and it is desirable to have the facility to supply hot tea/coffee as an alternative to alcohol if requested.

The report also outlined the additional measures that the applicant had indicated would be taken to promote and ensure the achievement of the four relevant licensing objectives.

While there had been no representations from Responsible Authorities, an objection had been lodged by the occupants of a neighbouring property. The applicant and his representative attended the meeting. The applicant's representative indicated that, following subsequent negotiations between the applicants and the interested parties, the interested parties would be prepared to withdraw their objection in the event of the applicant being prepared to revise his application for a variation of the premises licence by (a) restricting licensable activities to between 11.00 hours and 23.00 hours on Sundays to Thursdays and between 11.00 hours and 00.30 hours on Fridays and Saturdays; (b) prohibiting 18th birthday parties; and (c) erecting signage on the premises requesting customers to leave quietly.

The applicant confirmed his willingness to revise the application for a variation of the premises licence generally in line with the amendments suggested by the objectors. However, the applicant's representative indicated that, in so far as 18th birthday parties, they would be prepared to agree not to knowingly hold 18th birthday parties on the premises.

The Sub-Committee Members raised a number of pertinent issues with the applicant and his representative and considered all the written and verbal evidence in the context of the provisions of the Council's adopted Statement of Licensing Policy and Government guidelines. After taking account of all representations and relevant factors, the Sub-Committee arrived at the following unanimous **DECISION**:

"We have carefully considered the representations made by Mr Sumner, the applicant's representative, and note that the application has been amended in the light of the interested parties representations.

We also note that the interested parties have not attended today and we have had sight of an e-mail from the interested parties dated 28 June 2005 in which the interested parties confirm they have no objections to the amended hours.

We note that there appears to be an outstanding issue regarding 18th birthday parties. However, the applicant has offered up a condition which states that the licence holder will not knowingly permit bookings for 18th birthday parties on the premises.

Therefore, we grant the application for variation for the following hours:

Regulated entertainment Sunday - Thursday 11.00 to 23.00. Friday and Saturday 11.00 to 00.30 hours

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Alcohol on or off premises Sunday - Thursday 11.00 to 23.00

Friday and Saturday 11.00 to 00.30 hours

Late Night Refreshment Friday and Saturday 23.00 hours to 00.30 hours

The premises to be closed at the following times:

Sunday to Thursday Midnight Friday and Saturday 01.30 hours

The conditions set out in the operating schedule will be imposed on the licence together with the extra condition relating to 18th birthday parties.

We also grant the variation to remove the conditions relating to children under 14 and the restrictions in conditions numbers 3 and 5 on the liquor licence."

GENERAL PROCEDURE POINTS FOR HEARINGS

INTRODUCTION

The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee will conduct hearings in accordance with the following general principles:

- All parties have a right to a fair hearing.
- Decision-making will be conducted in an open, transparent and accountable way.
- Each application will be determined on its own merits and the decision will be based upon:
 - the merits of the application
 - the promotion of the four licensing objectives
 - the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy
 - the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- the Licensing Authority will only permit licensing decisions to be taken by sub-committee
 consisting of three members. In the event of one member being unable to attend, the Licensing
 authority will use it's best endeavours to substitute another member, taken from the
 membership of the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee reserve list.
- the Sub-Committee may disallow cross-examination in exceptional circumstances; this decision will be taken on a case by case basis with a presumption to allow. However, parties are advised that the Sub-Committee wishes to discourage hostile cross examination.
- late representations and evidence will usually only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- decisions will generally be taken regardless of whether the applicant/other party is present unless the Sub-Committee consider it necessary in the public interest to adjourn the hearing to a specified date. All notices and representations from absent parties will be considered.
- the Sub-Committee will generally allow parties a maximum of 30 minutes per party to make all relevant Statements. However, the Sub-Committee recognises that in certain circumstances this may be insufficient due to the complexity of the issues involved. In this situation the Sub-Committee will consider representations from those parties involved in the hearing as to the length required to make all relevant statements. The Licensing Authority respectfully requests that all parties keep points pertinent and the discussion moving in the interests of cost and efficiency.

- the Sub-Committee recognises that Regulation 14 requires all hearings should take place in public unless the licensing authority "considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing taking place in public" in which the applicant, those assisting the applicant or other interested parties can be excluded. In the absence of any criteria in the Licensing Act 2003, the guidance issued under section 182 of the Act or the licensing Regulations, the Licensing Authority has adopted the existing criteria in Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972 for excluding the press and public. The public and press will be excluded when the Sub-Committee is considering an application for a personal licence, where Lancashire Police have lodged an objection notice due to an existing relevant offence(s). Generally, the public and the applicant will be excluded when the Sub-Committee is determining a decision. Once a decision has been made all parties will be readmitted and the Chair will announce the decision and give reasons.
- all parties will be notified of the decision in accordance with any periods set down by the Licensing Act 2003 or where none are prescribed within 5 working days.
- the Sub-Committee has the right to exclude any parties behaving in a disruptive manner at the hearing at its own discretion.

Non Standard Times - 1100 to 03.00 on any Bank/Public Holiday other than on a Sunday

7. Hours premises are open to the Public

Non Standard Times - 11.00 to 01.00 on any Bank/Public Holiday other than on a Sunday

8. ADDITIONAL STEPS TO BE TAKEN TO PROMOTE LICENSING OBJECTIVES

The applicant has indicated that following additional steps will be taken to promote the licensing objectives:

- i) Prevention of crime and disorder
 - No irresponsible sales promotions of alcoholic beverages shall be offered to customers.
 - No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open to the public.
 - A sign will be displayed on the premises indicating the standard hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.
 - The DPS will be a member of the local Pubwatch
- ii) Public Safety
 - All fire doors will be maintained effectively self-closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.
 - Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently displayed.
- iii) The Prevention of public nuisance
 - When live regulated entertainment is taking place inside the premises after 22.00 windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut.
 - sign will be located at the exit(s) requesting that customers leaving the premises do so quietly and with consideration to neighbours
- iv) The protection of children from harm

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- No one under the age of 18 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 21.00 save on Christmas Eve and New Years Eve.
- Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.
- 10. Other Activities that may give rise to concern in respect of children

See point 11 below

11. Conditions/ Restrictions to be removed on variation.

To remove the restriction on children under 14 being in the bar areas imposed under s168 of the Licensing Act 1964 – thereby allowing all children to be in all parts of the premises as allowed by s145 of the Licensing Act 2003.

12. Relevant Representations – Responsible Authorities

There are no relevant representations.

13. Relevant Representations – Interested Parties.

There has been a relevant representation received to the application to vary from an interested party who resides close to the premises. The objection is relevant to the following licensing objectives - Prevention of public Nuisance

A copy of the representation in full is attached to this report in Appendix 2., and is in full below -

I refer to the recent application to extend licensing hours at the above and wish to object to the application on the following grounds –

Within the last two years there have been increased instances of anti social behaviour within the immediate vicinity of the public house. This occurs mainly at weekends in summer and usually either late at night or in the early hours of the morning. These instances are directly linked to the consumption of alcohol on the outside the premises.

The current management appear to have little consideration for the surrounding residential properties and it would appear that it is common practice to allow the continued consumption of alcohol, purchased prior to the calling of the time, outside the premises until the early hours. This often results in large amounts of broken glass being left on the frontage to the public house and adjoining pavement with no attempt being made to clean up the debris.

It is our belief that any extension to the current licensing hours will only exacerbate the current problems.

14 Policy Considerations

Section 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that a Licensing Authority must have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Act.

As members will be aware the four licensing objectives are as follows:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- prevention of public nuisance

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- the protection of children from harm.

The Licensing Act 2003 provides that where relevant representations are received the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider them unless the parties agree that a hearing is unnecessary.

The Licensing Authority in determining the application, having have regard to the representations, may take the following steps it considers it necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- reject the application in whole or in part
- ii) modify the conditions.

Members must have regard to the Statement of Licensing Policy when determining this application. In particular, member's attention is drawn to the following paragraphs:

Paragraph 1.3 The policy provides guidance on the general approach the Council, as Licensing Authority, within the meaning of the Act, will take in terms of licensing, However, each application will be considered separately, on its individual merits.

Paragraph 1.4. The Statement of Licensing Policy sets out how the licensing objectives will be achieved and to secure the safety and amenity of residential communities whilst facilitating a sustainable entertainment and cultural industry. The Policy recognises both the needs of residents for a safe and healthy environment in which to live and work and the importance of safe and well run entertainment premises to the local economy. Balancing these interests will not always be straightforward and will be guided by the four licensing objectives.

Paragraph 1.5 This policy does not seek to undermine the right of any individual to apply under the Act for a variety of permissions and as stated above each application will be considered on its individual merits. Nor does the Policy seek to override the right of a person to make representations on an application or seek a review of a licence or certificate. However, the Council in adopting this policy is indicating that a wide range of considerations will be taken into account.

Paragraph 2.2 Each of the licensing objectives are of equal importance with these objectives.

Paragraph 2.3 Each of the licensing objectives is of equal importance for the purposes of this policy.

Paragraph 2.4 This policy statement is designed to deal with matters within the control of the licensee. It focuses on the premises in which each business is carried on and the effect that has on members of the public living, working or engaged in normal activity in the vicinity.

Paragraph 2.5 Licensing law is not envisaged by the Licensing Authority as a mechanism to control anti-social behaviour by individuals once they are beyond the direct control of the licensee of any premises concerned. Therefore any terms and conditions imposed will be focused on matters within the control of individual Licensees and others granted relevant permissions. These matters will centre on the premises and places used for licensable activities and in the vicinity of the places.

Paragraph 2.6 The Licensing Authority considers that every holder of a licence, certificate or permission and designated premises supervisor is responsible for minimising the impact of their activities and anti-social behaviour by their customers within the vicinity of their premises.

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Paragraph 5.3 The policy will not fix the hours during which alcohol can be sold. The Licensing Authority considers that stricter controls regarding noise nuisance may be necessary in more densely populated areas. The grant of a licence will be dependent on the impact of an activity on the licensing objectives.

Paragraph 7.1 The policy recognises that longer (more flexible) licensing hours can contribute to easing crime and disorder problems by ensuring that concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously are avoided thus helping to reduce friction at taxi ranks, private hire offices, fast food outlets etc.

Paragraph 7.2 Individual applications will be considered on their merits and in general terms a flexible approach will be adopted. Fixed predetermined closing times for particular areas will not form part of the policy and restrictions on trading hours will be considered only where necessary to meet the licensing objectives.

Paragraph 7.3 The Licensing Authority, however, considers that the risk to disturbance to local residents is greater when licensable activities continue late at night and into the early hours of the morning as the ambient noise levels will be lower. The Licensing Authority may impose stricter conditions with regard to noise control in areas, which have denser residential accommodation, but each premises will be considered on its individual merits.

Paragraph 7.5 The Licensing Authority also recognises the principle of 24 hour opening of all licensed premises. However, it considers that longer opening hours may be more acceptable in commercial areas with high levels of public transport. The grant of a licence will in all cases be dependent on the impact of an activity in relation to the licensing objectives.

Paragraph 7.6 Where relevant representations are received, the Licensing Authority may have regard to the following where relevant (though this is a non exhaustive list);

- > the nature of the area where the premises are located (e.g. commercial, residential)
- > arrangements to ensure adequate availability of taxis and private hire vehicles, public transport.
- whether appropriate car parking is readily accessible to premises and whether the use/parking of vehicles would cause a demonstrable adverse impact on the amenity of residents.
- whether the licensable activities are likely to cause adverse impact especially on local residents and whether appropriate measures will be put in place to prevent any adverse impact
- ➤ in relation to the grant of a new premises licence whether the premises will give rise to a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives

In assessing the impact of the activity proposed the Licensing Authority may consider a number of factors inter alia.

- > the type and scale of activity, the number and nature of clientele likely to attend
- > the levels of noise from the premises, which may be acceptable later in the evening
- the proposed hours of operation
- the levels of public transport accessibility for customers and the likely means of public or private transport that will be used, access to private hire/taxis
- > the means of access to the premises e.g whether on principal pedestrian routes
- the level of car parking demand on surrounding residential streets and its effect on local residents, and movement of traffic
- > the cumulative impact of licensed premises in an area and scope for mitigation
- frequency of the activity.

Operating Schedules to set out the measures to be taken to ensure that the licensing objectives are addressed. Applicants are also referred to paragraph 6.6

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Paragraph 13.1 Licensed Premises have significant potential to adversely impact on communities through public nuisances arising from their operation.

Paragraph 13.2 The Licensing Authority is aware of the importance of the licensed trade to the local economy as well as in cultural and social terms. The Licensing Authority is also concerned to protect the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises. 'Vicinity' is not defined in the Act or Guidance issued by the Secretary of State. Whether or not incidents can be regarded, as 'in the vicinity' of licensed premises is a question of fact and will depend on the particular circumstances of the case.

Paragraph 13.3 The Licensing Authority will interpret 'public nuisance' in its widest sense and include such matters as noise emanating from the premises, light, litter, odour and anti social behaviour where these matters impact on those living or working in an area.

Paragraph 13.4 Activities that involve public entertainment, drinking or eating, have the potential to impact adversely on their surrounding areas due to noise, litter, and odours. There is also the potential for disturbance caused by those attending licensable activities. Late at night the impact of licensed activities is likely to be more objectionable to residents living close to a licensed activity, as the ambient noise levels are often lower so noise disturbance becomes more noticeable.

Paragraph 13.5 The policy allows for later opening hours except where there will be an adverse impact on the licensing objectives. In general the Licensing Authority will expect more comprehensive measures to be proposed at late night venues and/or where there has been a history of public nuisance.

Paragraph 13.6 On receipt of relevant representations, the Licensing Authority will assess the likelihood of it causing an adverse impact, by generally considering the following factors where relevant:

- the location of the premises (in particular proximity to residential and other noise sensitive premises, e.g. hospitals, nursing homes, hospices and places of worship)
- the type of activities, the number and nature of clientele likely to attend at the time of the application
- the proposed hours of operation
- ➤ levels of public transport accessibility for customers either arriving or leaving the premises (including taxis and private hire)
- > means of access to premises (whether on principal pedestrian routes)
- the level of car parking demand on any surrounding residential streets and its effect on local residents
- > the cumulative impact on licensed premises in an area
- > the scope for mitigating an impact i.e. CCTV, door supervisors
- > the frequency of an activity
- > the design and layout of the premises
- measures taken or proposed to be taken to prevent noise or vibration escaping from the premises e.g. sound proofing, air conditioning and sound limitation devices
- > measures taken to prevent unreasonable disturbance by customers/staff arriving and leaving the premises, goods deliveries etc
- > measures taken to lessen the impact of parking in the vicinity
- control of operating hours for all or parts of the premises (e.g gardens, last admission times and 'wind down' periods)
- measures to be taken to prevent drunkenness on the premises
- > measures to ensure collection and disposal of litter and waste outside their premises

Paragraph 13.7 The Licensing Authority when considering an application will take into account previous substantiated nuisance complaints particularly when a statutory notice has been served. Applicants may wish to have regard to the Good Practice Guide on the Control of Noise from Pubs & Clubs produced by the Institute of Acoustics and the British Beer and Pub Association.

Paragraph 13.8 On receipt of relevant representations, the Licensing Authority, where it considers it necessary and/or appropriate may attach conditions to a licence to prevent public nuisance including those drawn from the Model Pool of Conditions - see Appendix 3. In particular, it may attach a condition requiring the use of door supervisors licensed by the Security Industry Authority

Paragraph 13.9 The Licensing Authority requires Operating Schedules, where relevant to satisfactorily address the issue of public nuisance.

Paragraph 13.10 The Licensing Authority would also recommend applicants highlight local public transport links and taxi and private hire services within their premises, (including agreeing arrangements with nominated taxi and private hire firms for dropping off and collecting customers).

Paragraph 13.11 The Licensing Authority, will in accordance with the Guidance, focus on matters within the control of the individual Licence holder. The Licensing Authority accepts that the difficulty that a licence holder has in preventing anti-social behaviour by individuals once they are behind the direct control of the Licence Holder. However, the licensing objection of preventing public nuisance will not be achieved if customers from a premises regularly conduct themselves in an anti-social manner to the detriment of local residents or businesses. In addition, the Council has a duty to do all it can to prevent crime and disorder in the Borough under the Crime & Disorder Act 1998.

16. **Human Rights Act Implications**

The Human Rights Act 1998 makes it unlawful for a local authority to act in a way that is incompatible with the European Convention on Human Rights. The Council will have particular regard to the following convention Rights:

Article 6 that in the determination of civil rights and

obligations everyone is entitled to a fair public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by

law:

> Article 8 that everyone has the right to respect for his

home and family life;

that every person is entitled to the peaceful Article 1 of the First Protocol

enjoyment of his/her possessions including for

example, possession of a licence.

I refer to the recent application to extend licensing hours at the above and wish to object to the application on the following grounds.

Within the last two years there have been increased instances of anti social and drunken behaviour within the immediate vicinity of the public house. This occurs mainly at weekends in summer and usually either late at night or in the early hours of the morning. These instances are directly linked to the consumption of alcohol on and outside the premises.

The current management appear to have little consideration for the surrounding residential properties and it would appear that it is common practice to allow the continued consumption of alcohol, purchased prior to the calling of time, outside the premises until the early hours. This often results in large amounts of broken glass being left on the frontage to the public house and adjoining pavement with no attempt being made to clean up the debris.

It is our belief that any extension to the current licensing hours will only exacerbate the current problems.

To answer the question "What existing licensable activities are authorised by your existing Licence(s)?" raised in part A3, we have adopted the second limb (b) of the definition given in paragraph 1 of Schedule 8 to the 2003 Act ("any other licensable activities which may be carried on ... by virtue of the existence of the licence").

For these premises, covered by a Justices' On-Licence, there are two such "embedded" benefits:

- Playing of recorded music s.182 of the Licensing Act 1964 allows "...music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound" without the need for a Public Entertainment Licence; and
- 2. Provision of late night refreshment by virtue of the Late Night Refreshment Houses Act 1969. Section 1(2) exempts these premises from having to hold a Late Night Refreshment Licence from 10:00pm until 30 minutes after its permitted hours.

For these reasons, box f) recorded music and the box entitled Provision of Late Night Refreshment have been ticked as licensable activities which may be carried through the conversion process under "grandfather" rights.

If your Council has adopted the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing) Act 1967, the provision of entertainment facilities for music and dancing promoted for private gain where the functions are private in nature is also a further licensable activity which should be carried forward as an embedded benefit through the conversion process.




