11.30am

The Regiment, led by the Royal Engineers Band, will exercise their freedom by marching from St Thomas’s Square, turning left into St Thomas’s Road; right into Market Street; left into Chapel Street; left into New Market Street; left into High Street; right into Market Street filing past the Civic Party and guests on the Town Hall main entrance. The Regiment will then continue into Park Road and turn left into Back Mount and disperse on Farrington Street.
