	<p>Project to address Social Isolation</p> <p>Project to address social isolation in the area with focus on the creation of social activity opportunities for elderly residents</p>	<p>To reconnect with the Pensioner's Club attendees and establish new provision for socialising in central Adlington with a strong steering group and establish sustainability and succession planning.</p>	<p>In progress</p> <p>Initial scoping work gave insight into how the group used to run and why in the end it became impossible to sustain. Working with a former member of the Pensioners Club we have gained some interest in starting a group to take its place (apparently members have been glad of the rest but are now keen to be involved again).</p>

			<p>An initial open invitation to anyone who is interested in being a member of the new group or helping to run it took place on 3rd October at the United Reformed and Methodist Church.</p> <p>This provided an opportunity for people to help shape the activities the group will provide and for members to step forward to form a steering group/committee to hopefully provide a more sustainable structure going forward.</p> <p>The meeting was well attended with a combination of new and previous members. Initial discussions were very positive and early indications suggest a new group will be formed.</p>
	<p>Local History boards in Rivington and Anderton</p> <p>Provision of information boards detailing local history of the areas at Rivington Village Green and Headless Cross in Anderton</p>	<p>Information boards installed at identified sites which details local history of the area</p>	<p>In Progress</p> <p>Rivington Village Green Working with Rivington Parish Council we have identified the area and type of information/lectern to be installed. The Parish Council are currently pulling together the historic information to go on the board. We have chosen a provider to carry out the work and provide the design for approval.</p> <p>Headless Cross – Anderton Working with Anderton Parish Council we have identified the site and style of lectern. Parish Council are collating all the information to send to the chosen provider to produce the design.</p>

			<p>Potential difficulties could arise with approvals for installation on the selected site. The site is owned by LCC and first response received was we cannot install on that piece of land. We have challenged this and awaiting to hear back on hopefully how this can be progressed</p>

Estimated quotes suggest that each option is similar in price.
