- 3. The Police also feel the timing for the sale of alcohol is too late due to the nature of the area, and the nature of the business.



#### Dear Sir or Madam

I am writing to register my objection to the application from the Parkers Arms on Park Road, Chorley and also from the Queens Hotel on Preston Road, Chorley for extended licensing hours and particularly my objection to the granting of music licenses during those hours. The reasons for my objections are set out below.

#### Noise

• During warm weather the Queens opens the side door that leads directly from the street into its pool room. The duke box is always on and is always loud. I cannot go into my garden during pub opening hours because the noise is disturbing and offensive. Every year I complain to the council and the noise diminishes for a while but it soon returns to its normal level. It is a particular nuisance on bank holidays and weekends, the time when everyone should enjoy the holiday but it is always spoiled by the pubs.

#### Rowdy behaviour

- Both pubs have tables on the public pavement. They are frequently used by drinkers who cause a nuisance by shouting and by general rowdy behaviour. They can also be intimidating to passers by simply by their presence.
- Each weekend there is always broken glass and rubbish littering the pavements.

#### Quality of Life

- Park Road is a residential area, it is not fair or acceptable that residents are forced to endure the constant nuisance of the pubs. A previous landlord of the Queens installed a speaker on an outside window frame that he used to relay music from the duke box to the outside tables. The environmental health office ordered him to take it down, he did stop using it but the speaker is still attached to the window frame.
- I anticipate that if the pubs are granted extended opening hours and the license to play music into the early hours of the morning the quality of life of the residents

- of Park Road will deteriorate even further: the pubs will be creating an almost non-stop nuisance, even during those hours when people are trying to sleep.
- I have spoken to some of my neighbours and they are also afraid of the consequences of extended opening hours.

If the council decides to grant the licenses I would ask that it imposes conditions that would go some way to maintaining the balance between the interests of the businesses and the needs of the residents. The most important to my mind are listed below.

- That the tables are removed from the public footpath and that all drinking is done behind the closed doors of the pubs.
- That the pubs are barred from playing music after 11 p.m.
- That the outside doors to the pubs be kept closed at all times; that the door
  opening on to the street from the pool room of the Queens be made into an
  alarmed fire door.
- That the pubs install adequate sound proofing.
- That to prevent the temptation to keep the doors open in warm weather the pubs have air conditioning installed at the expense of the breweries that own them.
