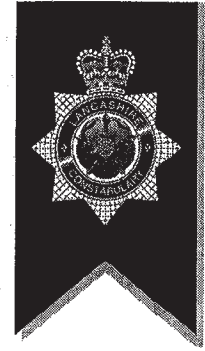

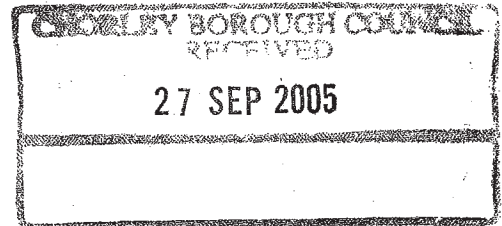

I am extremely concerned that any extension to the current license held by the pub would further invade my privacy.

On busy days and at the weekends especially during the summer, the noise nuisance is appalling, the shouting and swearing from people drinking outside in the beer garden is totally unacceptable. At night I am disturbed by the loutish behaviour of people leaving the pub who have had too much to drink, The disgusting language, scuffles and running fights which continue long after closing time is quite appalling. Cars and bikes rev up their engines before screeching off the car park, further disturbing the peace.

I fail to see how the granting of a license to enable the Ley Inn to continue to serve alcohol in the pub bar later into the night will do anything to improve the current situation that exists, I fear it will only make matters worse.

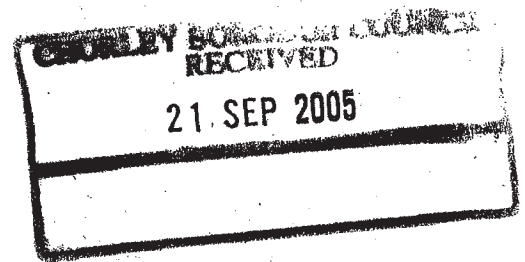

The thumping music from the juke box and the noise from the bar and games room especially on nights when there is a live sporting event on the large screen is deafening. At night we are disturbed by the loutish behaviour of people leaving the pub who have had far too much to drink, the heated arguments and foul language, the vicious scuffles and running fights continue in the beer garden and childrens playground long after closing time. This disturbing anti social behaviour continues into the early hours of the morning. Many of the late night drinkers are also the parents of children who have been left all day unsupervised shouting and screaming in the playground. The weekends, Christmas, New Year and bank holidays are truly unbearable. Surely it is an offence to serve alcohol to anyone who is already drunk.

We also live with the cooking smells and cigarette smoke that emit from the inefficient extractor fans that pollute the air day and night. These noisy fans are often left on all night to continue disturbing the peace of the early hours.

The situation at the Ley Inn seems to be out of control, the management appear unable or unwilling to curtail the activities of the loutish element that now frequent the pub. Where does the management's responsibility begin and end? We therefore request an urgent review of this license application.

Government forced to water down new drinks laws after fierce pressure from householders

LABOUR'S plans to allow 24-hour drinking were in disarray last night after a major Cabinet revolt, *The Mail on Sunday* can reveal.

The Government yesterday appeared to be watering down its proposals to allow pubs and clubs to open round the clock and was giving town hall chiefs more power to restrict licenses.

The move comes after a massive outcry and widespread fears that the change would fuel violent and anti-social behaviour – claims rejected by Whitehall.

But *The Mail on Sunday* has learned that the climbdown was prompted by senior Cabinet figures who warned Tony Blair that the effect of new licensing laws would damage the Government.

After a summer spent away from Westminster, several of Mr Blair's most trusted Cabinet colleagues said they feared the regulations due in November could lead to an explosion of binge drinking.

One senior Minister told *The Mail on Sunday*: 'I witnessed shocking scenes when I left the cinema at the same time as the pubs were closing.'

'Other Ministers have told of similar behaviour at a time when the Government is trying to bring in new measures to foster respect and responsibility in our society. Against this background we cannot be seen to be also advocating drunkenness and thuggery.'

Opposition to many applications by pubs all over the country to extend their opening hours has been fierce.

One example, which is representative, involves The Scarsdale pub in the Georgian conservation area of Edwardes and Pembroke Squares in Kensington, West London.

Residents have filed 300 letters of protest to their local licensing authority against plans submitted by the Spirit group pub to extend its hours and introduce unsuitable music, including karaoke, into what is a leafy residential area.

Labour peer's own fight

THE Government suffered another embarrassment last night when it was revealed that the head of an influential Labour-created quango is trying to stop his local pub extending its opening hours.

Ofcom chairman Lord Currie of Marylebone – a former adviser to Chancellor Gordon Brown – has written to Islington Council, North London, objecting in the 'strongest possible terms' to an application by the Hogshhead pub in Clerkenwell to stay open until 1am on Thursdays and 2am on Fridays and Saturdays. Lord Currie, 59, who lives in a luxurious block of flats close to the pub, was unavailable for comment last night but said through a spokesman that the Hogshhead had a history of excessive noise and drunkenness, a claim the pub denied.

The Government's sudden change of heart last night left the brewing industry and local authorities which administer the licences in confusion.

Pub and club owners were unclear about whether licence extensions they expected to be approved would now be rejected, while local authorities said they did not know if they had to judge the licence applications that have not been finalised on different criteria from those that had already gone through the system.

The new guidance also leaves question marks over all new

However, the Culture Secretary is virtually fireproof because of her close loyalty to the Prime Minister. Last night, the Department of Culture claimed 'nothing had changed'.

A spokesman said the Government was merely underlining the existing position that already encouraged local authorities to listen to the views of the public if they objected to proposed licence extensions.

He said: 'James Purnell will write to every local authority spelling out that where residents raise objections a council's primary concern is to promote the objectives of preventing crime, disorder and public nuisance.'

But a spokesman for the British Beer and Pub Association (BBPA), which represents 40,000 of Britain's 60,000 pubs and bars, said: 'We haven't had any information from the Government as to how this is going to work out.'

'We have no information on how it will work with regard to premises that have already been granted longer hours. It seems to be a changing situation.'

Nine out of ten of the bars and pubs the BBPA represents have applied for a change in licensing hours, he added.

The Local Government Association, which represents councils in England and Wales, was also unaware of how the guidance would change the application and appeals process.

Sir Sandy Bruce-Lockhart, LGA chairman, welcomed any change redressing the current guidance, which he described as 'too strong and too liberalising'.

The move is a major blow to the political prospects of James Purnell, the Minister responsible for the drinking legislation, who has been a major advocate of extended opening hours and convinced his colleagues it would lead to a Continental-style cafe society in Britain.

He was also behind Labour's controversial 2001 Election slogan – 'Couldn't give a XXXX for last orders? Vote Labour' that was sent to 5,000 mobile phones on the eve of the vote.

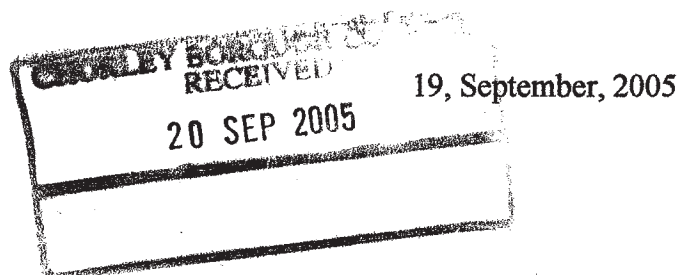

On busy days and at the weekends especially during the summer, the level of noise from people drinking outside in the beer garden is appalling. Many parents leave their children in the playground seemingly oblivious to their shouting and screaming which carries on throughout the day and late into the night. Midnight and after is not unusual. The childrens' playground and the beer garden are sited just a few feet from our garden separated only by the fence.

The noise from the bar and the games room on nights when there is a special sporting event live on the large screen is deafening. The music thumping from the juke box reaches such a pitch that it invades the house and from which there is no peace until the juke box is finally turned off. At night we are disturbed by the loutish behaviour of people who have had far too much to drink, the heated arguments and foul language, the vicious scuffles and running fights which continue in the beer garden and the childrens playground long after the pub has closed.

We also have to live with the cooking smells and cigarette smoke that emit from the inefficient extractor fans that pollute the air day and night until the early hours. We can not enjoy our own garden anymore. On many occasions we find that we have just have to go out somewhere for the day to find some peace and quiet. Christmas, New Year and bank holidays are truly unbearable.

Back Lane and Wood End Road have now become a racing circuit. Cars and Motor Bikes their engines and tyres screaming race each other around the roundabout at the junction of these two roads with little or no regard for the safety of anyone.

The situation at the Ley Inn seems to be out of control, the management appear unable or unwilling to curtail the activities of the loutish element that now frequent and rule the pub.
