Background to the report

- 6. The Chorley Clean Air Strategy sets out a clear picture of the current state of air quality and monitoring practices in Chorley, our legal obligations as a council in monitoring air quality and the legislation which governs this.
- 7. To support the development of the Clean Air Strategy a public consultation exercise was undertaken on Citizen Space from the 11th of June to the 16th of July 2021 and received 228 responses. The responses have been incorporated into the updated Clean Air Strategy.

Clean Air Strategy Update

- 8. A dedicated Air Quality Officer joined the Council in January 2022, this has combined the air quality work programme into one role and will help to achieve the proposed actions listed in the Clean Air Strategy.
- 9. The Clean Air Strategy has been updated to consider work completed over the previous 12 months, to identify new actions, improve accessibility and to incorporate results from the Clean Air consultation.
- 10. Since the initial draft of the Clean Air Strategy, Chorley Council has launched a separate Climate Change strategy. There is some crossover between the Air Quality Strategy and the Climate Change strategy as well as other corporate priorities. Therefore, for consistency and accountability some actions have been reviewed and incorporated elsewhere.
- 11. Results from the Clean Air Strategy Public Consultation have been reviewed and integrated into the updated Clean Air Strategy.
- 12. The previous action plan has been refreshed to update the milestones and introduce new targets to build upon the consultation and work already competed.

Climate change and air quality

- 13. The work noted in this report has an overall positive impact on the Councils Carbon emissions and the wider Climate Emergency and sustainability targets of the Council.
- 14. In particular the report impacts on the following activities:
 - a. net carbon zero by 2030,
 - b. energy use / renewable energy sources
 - c. sustainable forms of transport,
 - d. air quality,
 - e. green areas and biodiversity.
