Representations are being made for the following reasons:

Immigration Enforcement conducted a visit to the above premises on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022 following an allegation that the employer was hiring illegal workers. It was also alleged that the employer was paying the illegal workers below the minimum wage cash in hand to evade paying taxes.

During the visit two individuals were encountered that had no right to work in the United Kingdom.

A referral was made to the Civil Penalties Team for the employment of 2 illegal workers.

After consideration of all available information an initial No Action Notice was issued.
