EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF REPORT

- The Licensing and Public Protection Committee expressed a desire at its meeting on 16 September 2009 to receive a regular update report on the enforcement activity undertaken by the Councils Public Protection Team as well as details of licensing applications received and processed by the Neighbourhoods Directorate.
- A verbal update on enforcement activity will be provided at the meeting.

- Members requested details of organisations that are licensed to undertake house to house and street collections under the current period. These details are attached at Appendix B.
- In addition Members should note that a recent Licensing Sub Committee hearing which resulted in the revocation of a private hire driver's licence was the subject of an appeal to Magistrates Court. On appeal the Committees decision was reversed by the Court and the Council has been ordered to pay £2000 in costs.

- To ensure that Members are kept informed of the licensing activity within the Councils Public Protection Team.

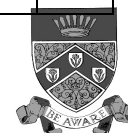
