ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

MANDATORY DRINKS CODE

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

ALCOHOL PROMOTIONS

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.



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(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective ;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner

DISPENSING ALCOHOL

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

FREE TAP WATER

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

AGE VERIFICATION

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either;
(a) a holographic mark, or .
(b) an ultraviolet feature. .

ALCOHOL MEASURES

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.



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EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1a) The Premises licence holder shall ensure that the admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act)
- 1b) Unless section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification board specified in this licence
- 1c) Where section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority
- 1d) Where no film classification board is specified in this licence admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.
- 1e) For the purposes of this condition:-
"children" means persons aged under 18; and
"film classification board" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

DOOR SUPERVISORS

The Premises licence holder shall ensure that each individual present on the premises to carry out a security activity [as defined by paragraph 2(1) (a) of the Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001] must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

SCHEDULE Mandatory Licensing Condition

MINIMUM DRINKS PRICING

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$
where-
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and



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(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 – CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

1. Upon commencement of their employment, all staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the licensing objectives so as to reduce crime and disorder, promote public safety, prevent public nuisance and promote the protection of children from harm. Refresher training will be provided at least once every six months and all training will be documented and made available to an authorised officer upon request.

2. The premises will be an active member of any local 'pub watch' or equivalent where such a scheme is in existence.

3. A comprehensive CCTV system shall be installed internally and externally at the premises and will meet the following criteria:

- o The system will display on any recording the time and date of said recording;
- o The system will be recording whenever the premises is open to the public;
- o Any recordings will be retained for a minimum of 31 days after they are made and will be produced to an authorised officer upon request, so long as said request is in accordance with the principles of the Data Protection Act or any subsequent or alternative legislation;
- o As a minimum, the CCTV will capture a 'head and shoulders' image of all people who enter through the main public entrance.

4. Appropriate signage alerting customers to the use of CCTV shall be displayed in a conspicuous position at the premises.

5. A competent person trained in the use of and operation of the CCTV will be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities are taking place. Said person will be able to fully operate the CCTV system and be able to download data in a recognised format when requested.

6. The premises licence holder shall require the designated premises supervisor, or in his/her absence other responsible person, to keep an Incident/Refusal Register in which full details of incidents are recorded. This shall include details of any refused sales and shall give details of the persons involved, incident description, time and date, time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The register is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to a Police Officer or Authorised Officer upon request.

7. Where the premises is proposed to be open to the public after 01:00hrs, a minimum of 2 door supervisors shall be on duty from 21:00hrs. From 00:00hrs, a minimum of 2 additional door supervisors shall be on duty. All door supervisors required by the condition shall remain on duty until the close of business or until the immediate



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vicinity of the premises is cleared of patrons, whichever is the later.

8. At any other time when licensable activities are to be carried on at the premises, a risk assessment will be carried out to determine whether door supervisors are required. An appropriate number of door supervisors will be utilised in accordance with said risk assessment, which must be in writing and must be produced to an authorised officer upon request.

9. The premises will have a written zero tolerance drugs policy which is enforced at all times.

10. The management of the premises will ensure that the area immediately outside the entrance to the premises is kept clean, tidy and free from litter.

11. On any occasion that regulated entertainment is carried on at the premises, regular assessments of the noise emanating from the premises will be undertaken. Wherever said assessments indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any local residents, remedial action will be taken. A written record will be maintained detailing the time of the noise assessments, the identity of the person undertaking the assessment, the results of the assessment and any remedial action undertaken.

12. The premises will have a written dispersal policy designed to encourage patrons to leave the venue and the area quickly and quietly.

13. No person shall be permitted entry to the premises after 0200hrs, save for persons who exit to smoke and then immediately re-enter the premises.

14. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the main public exit requesting customers to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

15. All windows and doors shall be maintained closed at any time after 23:00hrs, save to allow access or egress.

16. Recorded music shall not be played, and live music shall not be performed, in the external areas of the premises after 23:00hrs.

17. There shall be no persons under the age of eighteen permitted on the premises after 22:00 each evening, unless they are attending a pre-arranged, private function.

18. A "Challenge 25" Policy shall be adopted and enforced at the premises whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be required to provide identification to prove that they are over the age of 18 before they are permitted to purchase alcohol. The only forms of acceptable identification will be:

- o A Passport;
- o A UK Photocard Driving Licence;
- o Official ID card issued by HM Forces or EU bearing a photograph and the date of birth of the holder;
- o Any other form of identification agreed with a representative of the Police Licensing Unit

19. All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the "Challenge 25" policy upon the commencement of their employment, following which they will undertake refresher training at least once every twelve months. Said training will be documented and will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.



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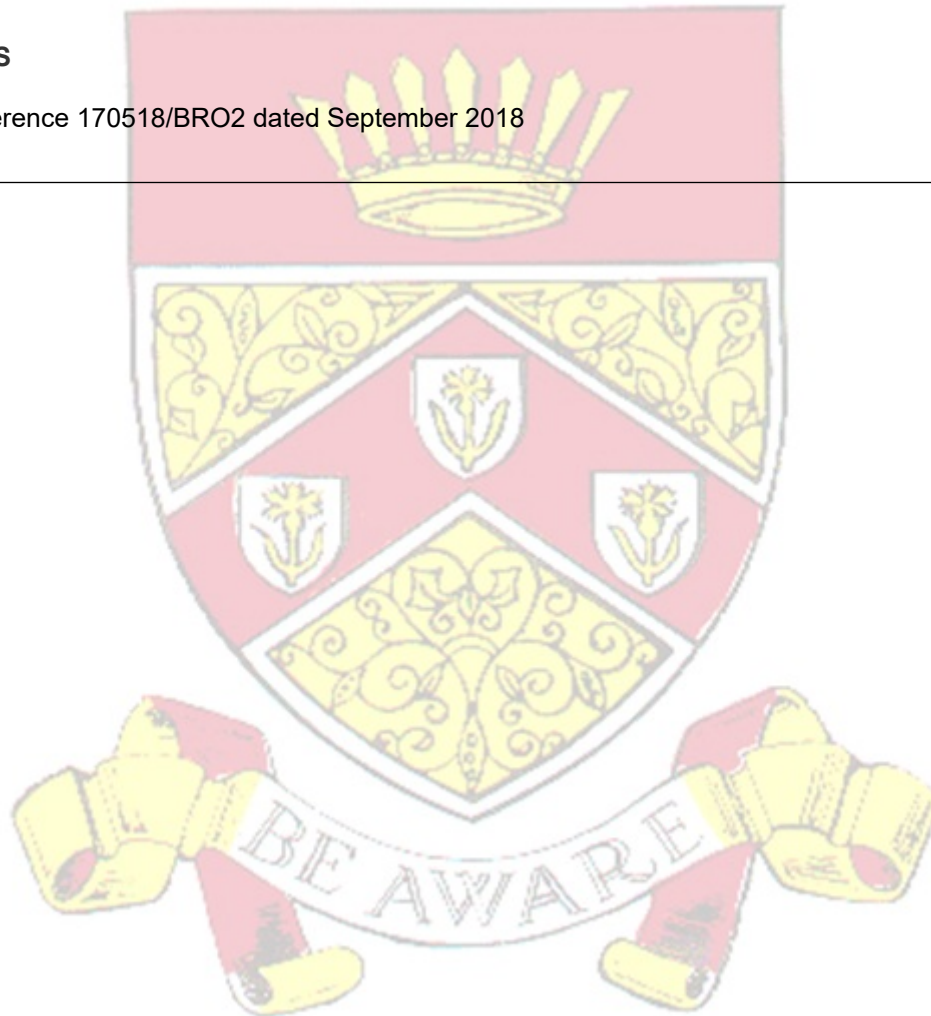
