I rang ██████████ back and explained everything to her. She said could I let Howard know that she is on holiday from 27 May for 2 weeks until 10 June.

She may also ring again after the closing date as she has concerns about which Councillors may sit on Committee. She alleged that Councillor McGowan is a regular in the Mitre.

There are the following police representations to be made in respect of this application:-

The police are concerned that the lifting of the condition will allow customers to drink outside the premises and therefore cause noise, disturbance and intimidation to local residents and passers by. The area is not sufficiently large enough to allow consumption outside and certainly in the summer months this would cause problems for local residents.

The condition was imposed to prevent noise and disturbance to residents and as far as the police are aware nothing has changed in this regard.

The need for people to smoke can be addressed by the smoking at the rear of the premises.

It is therefore felt that if this condition is lifted it would undermine the crime prevention and public nuisance objectives

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Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing to oppose the application made by D. Miller in respect of the Mitre Public House on Weldbank Lane. The applicant wishes to remove the condition on the premises that 'The front area of the premises shall not be used for the consumption of alcohol at all times' dated 21<sup>st</sup> March 2006.

As a resident of Weldbank Lane I feel that lifting this restriction would create noise disturbance which would affect both myself and others. Problems have been experienced previously when this area has been utilised and I feel that the beer garden at the rear of the premises provides ample space for customers.

I am also concerned that the area would create an increase in litter and also foul language. Both of these problems are difficult to monitor and supervise as bar staff will inevitably spend most of their time inside the premises. As residents we would therefore be left to endure such behavior as in previous years.

The Mitre is situated in the middle of a quiet residential area and as such I feel this application is inappropriate. It will greatly impinge on the surrounding area.

It is also a concern of mine that there may be a rise in the use of obscene language used, and as I have my young granddaughter living at my house, I am concerned that she may here this.

I do not believe it inappropriate to ask people visiting the public house to use the Beer Garden - which is provided at the back of this premise - for the use of socializing outdoors.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing in response to the notice of application to Vary a Premises Licence by D. Miller Trading Ltd in respect of The Mitre Public House, 73 Weldbank Lane, Chorley, dated 21<sup>st</sup> March 2006. The applicant seeks to remove the condition on the Premises Licence that 'The front area of the premises shall not be used for the consumption of alcohol at all times.'

I wish to express my objection to this application for the following reasons:

- \* Should customers wish to use outdoor areas to smoke and consume alcohol, a large beer garden is situated at the back of the premises providing ample space.
- \* My front door is adjacent to the proposed new drinking area, my privacy would be greatly affected when entering and leaving my home.
- \* The proposed drinking area is also directly underneath my bedroom window. I am already aware of the noise created by the drinking at the back of The Mitre; I am concerned that this new proposal will lead to further disruption at the front.
- \* The Mitre is situated on a direct route to Holy Cross R.C. High School, St. Gregory's R.C Primary School and St. Gregory's Church. When customers have previously consumed alcohol in this area, the language used on a regular basis has been inappropriate and it distresses me when my grandchildren hear it.
- \* There is a bus stop immediately outside The Mitre which is also used by the school children. By combining railings with the bus stop and bin that already exists in this area, all pedestrians, especially those using prams and wheelchairs would find their space restricted.
- \* The applicant states that Supervisors will collect litter when needed, however, if this litter is thrown into my front garden through the decorative railings, as I already experience, how will this be dealt with?

Since the original restriction has been enforced, I have seen on occasions, males drinking from pint glasses in this proposed area in order to use mobile phones. The Applicant has therefore already disregarded the restriction. As a result of this, I am concerned that the adequate supervision stated in the additional steps of the application will not be implemented.

The Mitre Public House is situated in a residential area and this new proposal will inevitably result in disturbance and lack of privacy to nearby residents. I therefore submit my objection.

I have observed on two occasions recently customers drinking on the front even whilst this restriction is in force.

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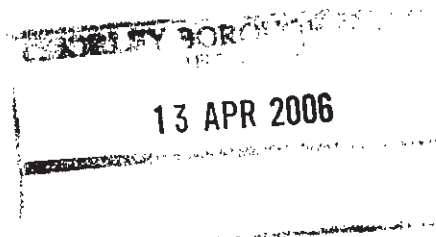

**Right of attendance assistance and representation**

- 15 Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

**Representations and supporting information**

- 16 At the hearing a party shall be entitled to-
- (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
  - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
  - (c) address the authority.

**Failure of parties to attend the hearing**

- 20 -
- (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
  - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may -
    - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
    - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence
  - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
  - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

**Procedure at hearing**

- 21 Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 22 At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 23 A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
- 24 The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for a regulation 16.
- 25 The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may —
- (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
  - (c) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify,
- but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

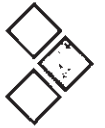

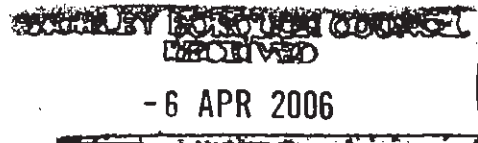

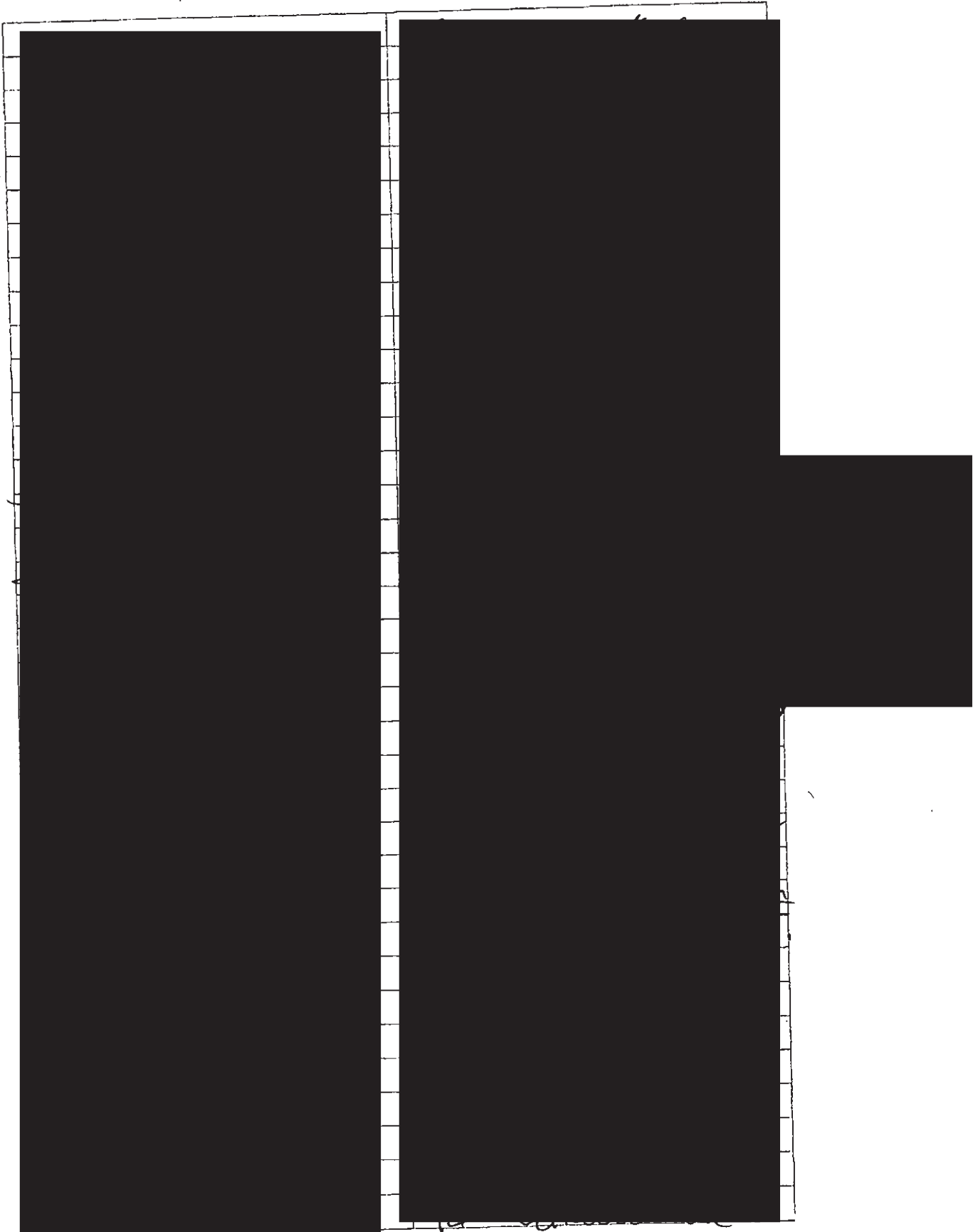

**If I have taken my dog for a walk and fancy a drink on the way home I used to be able to stop at the Mitre, sit outside (the dog is not allowed in) and have a pint.**

**If we are out with my daughter (6 yrs old) we could have a drink and sit out.**

**Could you imagine if this rule was applied in France or Spain? If we said to them NO DRINKING OUTSIDE IN THE SUNSHINE they would laugh and laugh and laugh. Are we part of the European Union or not?**

**Come on England come on Chorley sort this nonsense out. Give us our seats back. We probably only get 20 days sun a year. (If we are lucky)**

**Reference complaints from residents**

**I don't know for sure how many years the Mitre public house has been on Weldbank Lane (I assume that it is longer than any resident has ever lived there) So, if you buy a house near the Mitre you should be aware you are buying a property near to a pub and that people go there to have a drink. That's what public Houses are for.**

To whom it may concern,

With regard to the dictate that due to complaints, the tables outside the Mitre public house on Weldbank Lane, Chorley should be removed.

Although not a local, I use the Mitre on a regular basis, generally at weekend though on occasion's during the week.

I have not as yet witnessed anything with regard to unruly behaviour either inside or outside the establishment with one exception when a group of youths outside began jumping on the tables and shouting. On that occasion the staff on duty went out and sent them away and this incident was in the afternoon.

Having spoken to a few of the locals who use the Mitre, they are unaware of any complaints having been made in the area. Perhaps it would be prudent to check the sources of the complaints, to ascertain if they are correct and not just mischief being made by an individual before enforcing a rule that would disturb those who may wish to sit out as the weather improves.

Further I do not see how an ongoing problem, (which this must have been), can have existed when  
(1) The weather during the last few months has precluded anyone from wishing to sit outside and  
(2) The landlord has received no complaints himself from local residents, giving him an opportunity to respond

It would be appreciated if you could inform myself and others of your investigations to substantiate these complaints.

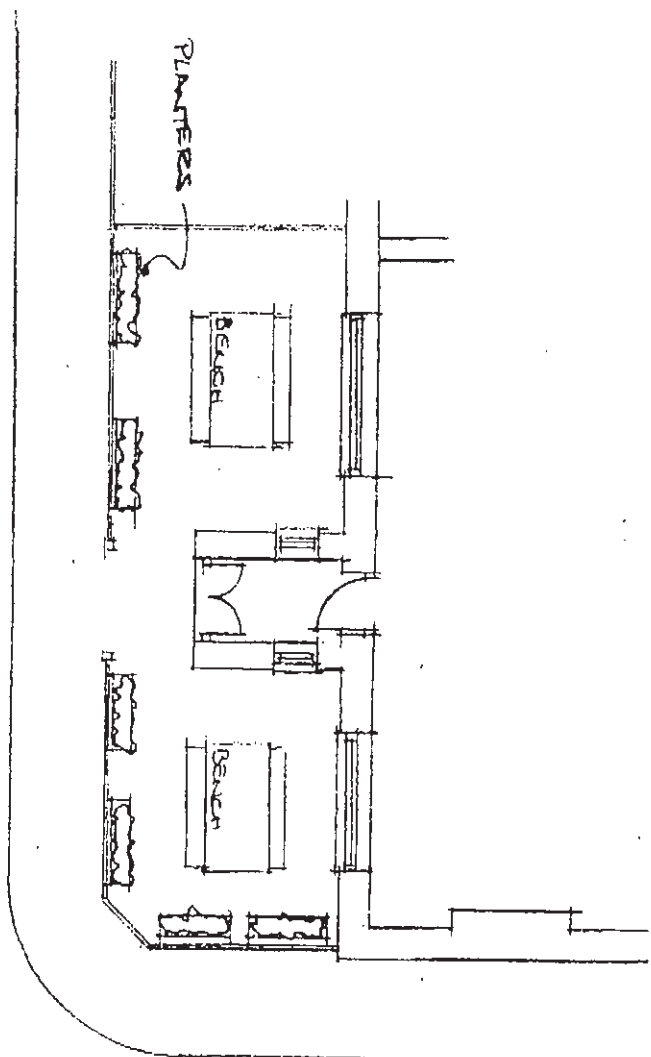


Proposed Front Elevation.



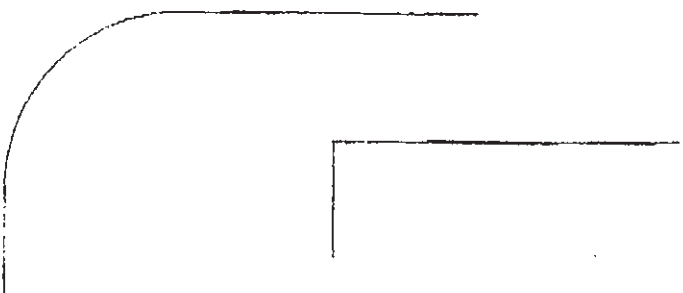
Proposed Side Elevation.

**ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

Section 19:

1. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that no supply of alcohol is made under the premises licence - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).
2. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

Section 20:

- 1a) The Premises licence holder shall ensure that the admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act)
- 1b) Unless section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification board specified in this licence
- 1c) Where section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

Service will be refused to anyone who is drunk, behaving in a violent or threatening manner, or who has been convicted of behaving in a violent or threatening manner on licensed premises.

Management will liaise regularly with the local police.

All bar staff are trained in basic licensing law, particularly with regard to serving drunks and serving under 18's.

At least 30 minutes will be allowed between last alcohol sales and the closure of the premises, the management will permit customers to finish their drinks within this period with access to the pubs and toilet facilities.

**c) Public safety**

None.

**d) The prevention of public nuisance**

The building is double glazed with recently installed mechanical ventilation and as such only negligible levels of noise escape.

Live music will end at 23.00hours.

Recorded music will end at 23.00hours Monday to Thursday and 00.00 Friday to Sunday.

All windows will remain closed after 22.00 hours.

Later operating hours will minimise noise from departing customers as they gradually disperse over a longer period of time.

The management will monitor people leaving the premises and where necessary remind them of their public responsibilities. Notices are displayed asking customers to be considerate when leaving the premises.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

The management operate a policy that complies with the pass accreditation system and identification checks will be made of any customer who does not appear to be 21 years of age. Acceptable identification being passports, driving licence or proof of age card.

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply.

### ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

- 1) A personal licence holder shall be on the premises during which intoxicating liquor is being sold or supplied to customers or consumed by customers except in the case of an emergency.
- 2) All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.
- 3) The licensee shall ensure that the area immediately surrounding the premises shall be cleared of glasses and bottled at the end of licensable activities each day.
- 4) Signs shall be erected to direct customers to the car park at the rear to restrict parking at the front of the premises.
- 5) Signs to be erected within the premises to request customers to leave quietly with consideration to neighbours.
- 6) The beer garden situated at the rear of the premises that is used for consumption of alcohol shall cease to be so used after 22.00 hours at all times.
- 7) The front area of the premises shall not be used for the consumption of alcohol at all times.
