ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

MANDATORY DRINKS CODE

Section 19:

The Premises licence holder shall ensure that no supply of alcohol is made under the premises licence - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

The Premises licence holder shall ensure that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

ALCOHOL PROMOTIONS

(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or



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substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in Section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

DISPENSING ALCOHOL

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

FREE TAP WATER

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

AGE VERIFICATION

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

ALCOHOL MEASURES

The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.



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EXHIBITION OF FILMS

Section 20:

- 1a) The Premises licence holder shall ensure that the admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act)
- 1b) Unless section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification board specified in this licence
- 1c) Where section 20(3) (b) of the Act applies, admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority
- 1d) Where no film classification board is specified in this licence admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.
- 1e) For the purposes of this condition:-
"children" means persons aged under 18; and
"film classification board" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984
(authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

DOOR SUPERVISORS

The Premises licence holder shall ensure that each individual present on the premises to carry out a security activity [as defined by paragraph 2(1) (a) of the Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001] must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ANNEX 2 – CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

Note – Some conditions may apply to one or more of the objectives

General

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Crime and Disorder

- 1 The premises shall have a CCTV system installed, operated and maintained to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary
- 2 The system shall be digital and have the capability of 24 hour recording the recordings to be kept for 28 days
- 3 There shall be a member of staff on duty at all times the premises is open who is trained and capable of providing a copy of any recording to any responsible authority on reasonable request.
- 4 The DPS will have a written drugs policy and all staff will have ongoing regular training in respect of its contents. This training will be recorded and copies of these records will be made available on request to any responsible authority.
- 5 Regular toilet checks will be made whenever the premises are open. A record of these checks kept and records will be made available on request of any responsible authority.
- 6 The DPS will have a written policy in relation to drunkenness and all staff will be subjected to ongoing regular training in respect of its contents. This training will be recorded and copies of these records will be made available on request to any responsible authority.
- 7 The DPS will ensure the premises will maintain an incident book and will retain a record of all incidents relating to the premises, its staff and customers, including time, date, nature of incident and outcome to the



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satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary and the Local Authority. This record will be available on request to any responsible authority.

8 Customers shall be prevented from leaving the premises with unsealed glasses, bottles or other containers.

9 No drinks will be consumed outside the premises other than in any area set aside for such purposes.

Public Safety

Public Safety

1 All fire doors will be effectively self-closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.

2 Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the fire brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently displayed

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Prevention of Public Nuisance

1 No amplified sound will be played in the external areas.

2 After 22:00 each day the windows and doors will be kept closed whenever regulated entertainment is taking place.

Protection of Children From Harm

Protection of Children from Harm

1 The Premises will have in place a written policy, to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary to prevent the sale and supply of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. This policy shall state that any person who does not appear to be at least 21 years of age, will not be served unless they can produce a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS), photocard driving licence or passport.

2 Notices will be displayed where they can be clearly seen and read in the premises indicating that the premises operates a Challenge policy in relation to the sale of alcohol.

3 All staff will be subject to ongoing training in relation to age related sales. This training will be recorded and made available, on request to any responsible authority.
