# Reference the Application of the Roebuck Inn, Waterhouse Green, Whittle-le Woods for a Licence for Extended Opening Hours and for the Playing of Music.

We were dismayed to read in the Chorley Guardian the notice for the above change of licence.

We would earnestly ask the Licencing Committee of the Chorley Borough Council to take into consideration our comments with respect to this application.

The premises are located in a residential area. They are surrounded by private properties whose residents value their privacy and peace of mind.

We already experience, on numerous occasions, excessive noise both from customers using the outside tables and from those leaving the premises. Frequently this involves shouting and the use of foul language and the revving up of car engines and the use of loud car radios late at night.

We have had beer bottles and glasses thrown into our garden and, on one occasion, a beer glass smashed against the front of our house. Also, one of our cars has been vandalized on TWO occasions. These incidents were reported to the police. If the licensee is allowed to officially keep these new hours it means that the noise will continue until 2am over the weekend and 1am during the rest of the week.

From our experience it seems that the landlord makes no attempt to reduce the noise or the nuisance in any way by the placing of formal notices outside the premises.

We therefore strongly oppose this application. Whilst we recognize that the landlord has to make a living we do not believe that it should be at the expense of the local residents, few of whom frequent the premises in question.

The Roebuck Inn has a reputation as a venue for 'Football Aficionados'. This creates sufficient noise on the occasions when there are 'Big Matches'. To add the nuisance of a music licence would be too much.

We feel that the current licencing arrangements should NOT be amended.

In respect to the above application I would like to register a formal objection to the request for

- 1. Extended trading hours (Until 0000hrs on Sun-Thurs and until 1am on Fri and Sat)
- 2. Musical Entertainment within these hours

We strongly believe proceeding with this application would create a public nuisance well beyond reasonable hours in a quiet residential area, especially in light of granting permission to play music late at night. Waterhouse Green is an area of environmental preservation with many houses being Grade II listed, granting this license would severely challenge this, with the negativity surrounding the local pub dominating what is a beautiful area.

The Roebuck Inn, can become a busy public house, with an outside beer garden to the front and rear, an extended opening licence would create patrons both inside and outside the establishment until the early hours of the morning, when drinking up and clearing out time is taken into consideration, and in some cases people with drinks moving into the road, followed also by traffic (taxis) collecting people. Taxi's also beep their horns to indicate their presence, this is also unacceptable given the timing involved.

Thus creating a busy highway, again well into unsociable hours, mixed with alcohol fuelled people. In today's binge drinking society this situation would need to be policed. This is already an issue with the pub operating within current licensing laws.

With respect to the music licence, again one of the main causes of pollution is noise, this can be heard in many local houses whereas with no music the pub is less of a burden on the local environment. This is a problem when the front door of the pub is open, as it frequently is, to access the beer garden front and rear.

The parking situation around the public house would also create an unnecessary burden on the local residents possibly preventing them from parking near their homes.

The net effect of this decision would be detrimental to both the local residential area and local community, and an additional drain on emergency resources (including environmental noise pollution control) with many dispersed areas within the borough.

We do not wish to stop the advancement of change or impact on a business. However, we feel the council has a duty to recognise and protect the people and the environment we live in.

Should the council wish to grant extended opening hours within borough then we believe it should be done responsibly in a non-residential area where like-minded people can socialise together, especially where music is involved. Creating a central area would allow the borough to concentrate their policing and emergency resources in a small area reducing both manpower requirement and ultimately costs.


This is a view shared by many local residents.


Re: Notice of Application for Variation of Premises Licence under the Licence Act 2003 – Roebuck Inn, Waterhouse Green, Whittle-le-Woods, CHORLEY PR6 7LE

We wish to express our concern about the application made by the above establishment to extend opening hours until 0000 (midnight) Sunday to Thursday and until 0100 Friday and Saturday. The Roebuck Inn is situated in the heart of a village community, with many residential properties located within its immediate vicinity. We currently live within fifty meters of the pub and from August 1997 until July 2004 we lived directly opposite the premises. We value the benefits that living in a friendly, rural community offers, however we are extremely concerned about the effects of extending the opening hours of the Inn. On many occasions (particularly during summer evenings) customers at the Roebuck drink outside the premises and their language, behaviour and general demeanour is often aggressive, offensive and abusive. We have witnessed customers leaving the Inn and urinating and vomiting in the street and in gardens. On many occasions over the past eight years there have been incidents of customers fighting in the street after leaving the premises. We have observed the police attending the Inn on several occasions. Such incidents are disturbing, upsetting and unpleasant. On many occasions customers at the Inn park their cars in front of the building, leaving the car doors and windows open and then turn on their car stereos. Music is played at excessive volumes and this again creates disturbance for local residents.

Over the past eight years we have witnessed customers leaving the Roebuck long after closing time; we have seen people exiting the premises at 2pm on occasions. Again our concern is that if the licensing hours are extended this problem will be exacerbated. We appreciate that extended opening hours may well be appropriate for licensed venues in town centres; a village pub should serve the needs of the local community and in our opinion there is no need for the Roebuck's opening hours to be extended.

We hope that our views will be given due consideration by the Licensing Unit.

### **EMBEDDED BENEFITS**

To answer the question "What existing licensable activities are authorised by your existing Licence(s)?" raised in part A3, we have adopted the second limb (b) of the definition given in paragraph 1 of Schedule 8 to the 2003 Act ("any other licensable activities which may be carried on ... by virtue of the existence of the licence").

For these premises, covered by a Justices' On-Licence, there are two such "embedded" benefits:

- 1. Playing of recorded music s.182 of the Licensing Act 1964 allows "...music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound" without the need for a Public Entertainment Licence; and
- 2. Provision of late night refreshment by virtue of the Late Night Refreshment Houses Act 1969. Section 1(2) exempts these premises from having to hold a Late Night Refreshment Licence from 10:00pm until 30 minutes after its permitted hours.

For these reasons, box f) recorded music and the box entitled Provision of Late Night Refreshment have been ticked as licensable activities which may be carried through the conversion process under "grandfather" rights.

If your Council has adopted the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing) Act 1967, the provision of entertainment facilities for music and dancing promoted for private gain where the functions are private in nature is also a further licensable activity which should be carried forward as an embedded benefit through the conversion process.
