3a. NEET

Nighat Parveen provided an update on NEET in each of the three areas; Chorley, South Ribble and West Lancashire. It had been agreed that local Partnership Boards would receive an update on NEET in November, February and June, as these are the times when the NEET figures are most accurate, due to the movement of young people.

Recruitment is currently taking place for three Locality Managers and one will be appointed for each area (Chorley, South Ribble and West Lancs). At present each of the three areas are performing better than the County set target.

4. LANCASHIRE SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN BOARD

Richard Matthews gave an update on the CSE e-learning tool which is a free training package available on the LSCB website or via a link from the Children’s Trust website. The training provides a basic Level 1 awareness of CSE and all partner agencies are asked to promote in their organisations, and encourage staff to complete.

Richard also provided an overview of the minutes of the Lancashire Safeguarding Children Board which had been provided with the agenda.

The Board agreed:

- That the minutes of the LSCB be noted.

5. PREVENTION AND EARLY HELP

The Board discussed the District Prevention and Early Help quarterly update that had been provided with the agenda. It was noted that there are some areas where take up isn’t as high, in particular around Parenting Support. There were concerns about how the information was available for partners to access the service, and whether partners were aware of it.

The Board agreed:

- That further detail was required from Early Help Commissioners about the reasons for the low take-up; was this due to level of need or barriers to accessing the service. More clarification around the figures was required.

Andrea Smith provided an update on further development of the action plan, in particular the Raising Aspirations project. This project would work with Young Enterprise, local schools and local businesses to create employability skills. The role of the CSRWL CPB would be to act as an influencing Board rather than delivery of the project. There are already interested partners and some funding may be available through City Deal.

Contact details would be required from partners for local businesses, primary schools and special schools. It was agreed that it would be useful to use case studies to help advertise the scheme.

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Summary from LSCB held on Friday 20 March 2015

LSCB Training

The LSCB training application process will become electronic within the next week or two. All details will be on the LSCB website.

Serious Case Reviews

There is a serious case review due to be published at the end of March/early April. It is a Tameside SCR but Lancashire agencies had a significant amount of involvement. There are three other SCRs currently being undertaken by Lancashire LSCB.

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) Diagnostic

The LSCB has completed a diagnostic about CSE services in the Lancashire area. This was an exercise in 'taking stock' of what is happening in Lancashire at the present time. The final report was agreed by the LSCB today and will be sent out to agencies with a request that they respond to the findings.

The CPBs are being tasked with monitoring multi-agency work around CSE in their local areas and an Action Plan has been shared with most CPBs now to assist them in collating evidence and challenging where appropriate.

Burnley Multi Agency Safeguarding Practice Inspection (MASPI)

There is a flyer attached that explains what the MASPIs are and how they are undertaken. There was one completed in Burnley in October and the findings from this were shared with the LSCB today. Burnley and Pendle CPB is monitoring progress with actions emerging from that MASPI.

Three MASPIs take place every year and they may be coming to a place near you soon.

Local Adult Safeguarding Board (LSAB)

Discussions about whether it is possible for the LSCB management team to also deliver the management function of the LSAB are continuing.

Restructures and Cuts

Agencies have been asked to report to the LSCB about their restructuring activity and whether any planned cuts will impact on safeguarding work.

Performance Framework

The LSCB has adopted a regional performance framework tool which is huge in size and breadth of content. It was agreed that the management team will continue trying to populate the tool, but accepted that it may not be possible to complete in its entirety.

Member portfolio

The LSCB agreed a new member's portfolio, which includes induction, training and continuing professional development. This will be implemented now.

Ofsted Thematic Inspection of Early Help

Some recommendations for LSCBs in this thematic report, although it was felt that Lancashire does have good evidence of work in this area. It was agreed that a future LSCB meeting would be a thematic Early Help meeting.

Business Plan

The LSCB agreed a new Business Plan for 2015/16 where the main priorities are around CSE and children missing from home, education or care.

Lancashire Safeguarding Children Board Newsflash

The Local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB) is a key statutory body in Lancashire that supports agencies in working together to safeguard and promote the welfare of children as well as checking how effective that work is.

Multi-Agency Safeguarding Practice Inspections

The LSCB in Lancashire previously agreed to undertake multi-agency 'safeguarding practice inspections'. This means that the partner agencies of the LSCB have agreed to be part of a rolling programme of unannounced inspections across the County, with a view to helping agencies deliver the best service for children and their families.

The safeguarding practice inspections will involve case file audits across agencies, practitioner interviews and work shadowing, based on the inspection framework used by Ofsted. The 'review team' will be made up of managers from partner agencies. They will aim to evaluate the quality of services being offered to children and families and identify good practice or areas for improvement.

The programme of Safeguarding Practice Inspections across the County is now well established and inspections take place three times per year on a locality basis. Agencies are given two weeks' notice about an impending practice inspection in their area.

Child Sexual Exploitation

1. Purpose of Report

To update the Children and Young People's Trust on the aims of the local Community Safety Partnership relating to CSE. Possible ways of joint working between CYP Trust members and CSP members to achieve prevention and intervention of CSE cases across Chorley, South Ribble, West Lancashire and Preston - a separate proposal has been provided to the Preston CYP trust which is aligned to the joint CSP principles.

2. Background

Priority - Child Sexual Exploitation

We recognised that child sexual exploitation is a crime that can affect any child. This is why in Lancashire, we are committed to working together to tackle the problem.

3. Actions

- We will improve our understanding of vulnerability and the risk of harm in order to better target resources and safeguard children from sexual exploitation and support delivery of the LSCB CSE Strategy for Lancashire.
- We will encourage the use of CSE e-learning package.
- We will support Safer Lancashire campaigns and ensure local distribution of materials and e- messages.
- We will review lessons learned from recent CSE national reviews and develop a plan to implement recommendations including our approach to licensing.
- Support the establishment of co-located teams with children's social care, Police and PACE.

4. Outcomes

- Increased awareness of CSE
- Increased identification of Children at risk of harm
- Safer Management of those cases.
- Wider basic knowledge accessible by all.
- Greater awareness of and access to services
- Safe guarding of passengers and drivers.
- Coordinated response to CSE

5. Outputs

- Establish CSE task group to establish analytical problem profile using data from a range of partner organisations to inform the planning of responses to CSE priorities, including identification of partnership capacity.
- CSE Project funded by PCC – led by South Ribble Council to source suitable training to be delivered face to face and via train the trainer model in 2015.



- All practitioners working with children and young people to have accessed e-learning package available through LCC
- CSE task group to establish key messages to be fed through district community safety websites and wider partnership.

- Review of sharing of information between departments e.g. licensing (EH) and community safety partners.
- CSE task group to identify suitable package of training to be offered to all licensed services to ensure those organisations and individuals providing licensed services are aware of vetting procedures and duties of care.
- Develop and implement tactical multi-agency interventions which disrupt perpetrators and aid intelligence gathering and investigation of offences, whilst also providing a proactive multi-agency approach to prevent CSE.

6. Decisions/Actions Required

We are requesting that the Children's and Young People's Trust Board share their objectives, actions and desired outcomes with the Community Safety Partnership and consider a focused task and finish group in partnership with the South CSP (Chorley, South Ribble & West Lancs, please note this will also include Preston who are in the process of approaching their Children's and Young Peoples Trust Board).
