Issues for discussion:

1. Results of the Member's polling station review 2022 survey for information.

Recommended decision

- 2. That no changes to polling station are recommended, with the exception of, using St Chad's Church Hall instead of a portacabin as was originally approved at the council meeting in November 2021.
- 3. Increase in appropriate signage at St George's Primary School, to be displayed at the entrance on Carr Lane be recorded as a requirement for future elections.

Report/information (attached):

- 4. After each election, it is usual practice for the Returning Officer (RO) to consider the success of polling stations used that year. Once the review is complete, a report, including any recommendations is presented at a council meeting in time for the next year's election.
- 5. To inform his decision, the RO conducted a survey of elected members during the month of July to seek their views and understand any issues that may have not already been brought to his attention.
- 6. Members were able to respond to the survey on multiple polling stations, and in total there were 14 responses. A summary of the main responses and proposed actions are detailed below –

		As the electorate for all three polling stations were in the same boundaries for borough ward and county division it was proposed the number of polling stations in this area be reduced from three to two.
		At the council meeting in November 2021, members approved recommendations that voters normally attending St Mary's Social Club would instead attend Trinity Methodist Church. There would be no changes to St George's Church.
		The RO felt that the was insufficient reasons put forward to use St Mary's Social Club

7. Other polling stations highlighted in the survey which were considered appropriate for polling station use and received positive responses were Whittle-le-Woods Village Hall

(Buckshaw and Whittle Ward); Astley Village Community Centre, St Joseph's Parish Centre and St Peter's CE Primary School (Chorley North & Astley Ward); Clayton Brook Village Hall (Clayton East, Brindle and Hoghton Ward); The Fields Community Centre (Eccleston, Heskin & Charnock Richard) Buttermere Community Centre (Chorley South West) and Duke Street Primary School (Chorley South East & Heath Charnock). For these polling stations no changes are proposed.
